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2. INSIGHT and SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

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USA Election. Biden has been announced as the US-President Elect, surpassing Trump by less votes than polls have shown. Biden advised that once he is sworn into office on January 20, 2020, he will make COVID-19 his number one priority. The USA seeing its fourth daily case record in a row, and has surpassed 10 million cases. Total cases in Texas have reached over 1 million, with over 50,000 people hospitalized in the USA and over 10,000 in Intensive Care Units (ICUs). It is believed that Biden will base his COVID-19 response on science, with most of the staff in the task force being health experts and physicians. He is rumored to release the names of his 12 person COVID-19 taskforce next week. However, by January 2020, without special measures, the already exponential growth of the virus in the USA will only continue to increase, especially after holiday gatherings many will refuse to forego.

The President Elect will have his work cut out for him. Bringing the country together despite a vocal and strong opposition to the current presidency. Citing over 71 million votes for the Republican party, slightly less than the votes for the Democratic party. Such a division will require that the incumbent show he is working for all Americans. Additionally, American media may need to reassess their messaging, as the dislike for President Trump does not appear to run as deeply as presented in the mainstream media. This fact reflects that many Americans do not feel comfortable sharing their political views or overall beliefs. Mainstream media paints those people as anti-progressive or as having "stupid" opinions; subsequently distancing many Americans who may feel they have no other option for news except the Fox network. The USA has proven itself to be a country with varying points of view. Given the severity of the pandemic, this appears to be a time when unification is needed most.

Vaccine. Pfizer has just released information confirming that the vaccine's efficacy exceeded expectations; however, the 90% effectiveness results should be met with "cautious excitement". Individuals are still wary about receiving a COVID-19 vaccine. It is believed that those who are more motivated to avoid COVID-19, such as the vulnerable or those who live or work with the vulnerable will likely lead in taking the vaccine. Additionally, the vaccine will not be available to all members of the public in the beginning. Groups such as the elderly, immunocompromised, those with pre-existing conditions and those who work with these groups are slated to be the first to be offered the vaccine. Experts advised that like other public safety measures, like seatbelts, it takes time for the public to realize the new option is safer than not doing anything to prevent the potential harm.

There are some obvious discrepancies when comparing COVID-19 to other public safety campaigns, such as seatbelts. For instance, some of the public was against seatbelt wearing, fearing that it would cause more injuries than no seatbelts and a seatbelt is not a blend of unknown substances that an individual must have injected into their body. The average person, who has little knowledge about science or vaccines, who hears concerns about vaccines, may fixate on the possibility that a polio vaccine once caused paralysis, that their loved one could have a negative outcome. For this reason and other information found on vaccinations, it is believed many will continue to have a pessimistic view of vaccinations. Unfortunately, it appears that vaccination acceptance has reduced in almost all of Canada by at least 3% from July 2020, suggesting that a push for a quick vaccine without proper safety measures is counterproductive to overall efforts. Public health campaigns outlining and explaining the decision making that led to approving the virus should be implemented. The campaigns should demonstrate a transparent process, from the company producing the vaccine right up to the government officials approving it. In the past, Health Canada has refused to provide clinical vaccination information regarding the HPV vaccine, advising that it is proprietary business information held by the vaccine maker. This information was only released when a

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researcher who wanted to conduct a systemic review of the vaccine's safety took Health Canada to the Supreme Court of Canada and won. As such, government officials must be very careful when it comes to the public perception regarding the approval of such high-profile health measure, as well as its method of approval.
